Colorado Stone Quarries Supports Youth Art Park

Carbondale, CO - August 29, 2022: <u>Colorado Stone Quarries</u>, who operates the Yule Creek Mine in Marble, will donate marble to the forthcoming <u>Youth Art Park</u> (YAP), a dynamic space for art and play for those young in age and young at heart. The YAP is a project of the Carbondale Creative District (CCD) and Carbondale Arts along the Rio Grande ARTway. The Park will be located behind the Carbondale Recreation Center on the ARTway and is slated to start being built out this fall.

The YAP, brainstormed by many community members including Carbondale middle schoolers, thoughtfully curated by Amy Kimberly, Carbondale Arts Executive Director, and designed by local landscape architect Nicholas DiFrank of RE : LAND, is a heart and soul endeavor of the CCD. Amy Kimberly and the team at Carbondale Arts have installed two other parks along the ARTway in partnership with RFTA, the Latinx Folk Art Garden and Derail Park, but the Youth Art Park is a much larger scale project. The Park will be built in multiple phases and include an outdoor amphitheater, a climbing wall, a slide, and more.

As Carbondale Arts started to really look at the scope of this project, they knew they would need amazing local partners to get excited about the park and support by contributing materials. Marble is needed for many park components and who better to partner with than Colorado Stone Quarries.

When asked what encouraged Colorado Stone Quarries get involved with the project, Jean St-Onge, their General Manager, said, "Our Team at Colorado Stone Quarries strongly believes in the power of community support and involvement, which has been a cornerstone of success of Yule Marble mining and production throughout history.
